  - Legislation
    - SB 809 Modifies restrictions upon businesses distributing cocktails for off-premises consumption.
    - HB 2995 Requires food courier services to have agreements with restaurants in order to pick up and deliver from them and permits restaurants to file complaints to the Corporation Commission where couriers are operating without such agreement.

## **MEETING MINUTES - CONTINUED**

- SB 1762 Removes the maximum number of charitable alcoholic beverage event licenses that institutions of higher education may obtain during a 12-month period
- HB 3076 Adjusts various provisions related to alcoholic beverages, establishing standards for straw testing and introducing additional fees
- HB 3353 Relates to wine and spirits wholesaler license; providing for the ability to sell to a charitable organization
- HB 3995 Requires portable fire extinguishers to be installed in mobile food establishments which produce smoke or grease-laden vapor
- o Tulsa has been absent from counties receiving complaints about inspections starting during peak business hours. The self-inspection form has been used a lot.
- DeBrena Hilton shared the new Safety Posters from THD Marketing
- Meeting was formally adjourned at 2:48 p.m.
